

Open Photo Story.


Choose begin a new story and click next.

Click on the “Import Pictures” button.

You will need to remember where you stored the pictures.

Click on the pictures that you want to add to your photo story. If you want to add more than one picture from a particular folder use ctrl-click. Then click ok. Continue to add pictures until you have them all imported.

The Import Window



The edit window has three tabs. The first tab is shown here. The other two tabs are shown below.

Use these buttons to rotate photos.

To crop your photo click the box next to the word crop. This will give you a box on top of your picture. You can adjust the size of the box and move the box around to highlight the area of the photo that you want to show.

After you are finished cropping click save. Close this window if you are finished editing or choose a different tab

Note: If your story contains a large number of pictures, it may take a few minutes for Photo Story to apply the effect to all of the pictures.

Check this box if you would like to apply the special effects to all of your pictures.

When you are finished importing and editing your pictures click the next button.

Next you will come to the Add Title Screen. Here you can add titles and words to your pictures. You can also add an effect to your picture on this screen. **Be sure to select the picture in the film strip that you want to add the text to.**

When you are finished adding titles to your pictures click the next button.

This screen will allow you to add narration to your pictures. You can also customize the motion of the pictures. Be sure to select the picture from the film strip that you want to add narration to. You will need a microphone to record the narration.



Click here if you would like to adjust how long a picture is displayed. This may be helpful to you if you want one photo to display longer than others. Click the preview button to check your work.

In the transition tab of the Customize Motion Window, you can add transitions between you photos. **Be sure that there is a check in this box before you begin.**




Use the scroll bar to see all of the different transitions.

Click on the transition you want to select.

Preview your work to see if you like the transition you chose.

Click here if you would like to change the time the transition takes.

When you are finished narrating your pictures and creating your custom motion click the next button.



In the Add Background Music Window you can select music that you have saved on your computer or you can create your own music in Photo story. To add music you have saved on your computer click this button. You will need to remember where your music file is stored. Double click on the name of the music.


Click this button if you would like create music to add.

Click this button if you would like to delete music from a picture.

Use the slide to make the music low or high. If you have narration in your photo story you want the music to be lower so the narration can still be heard.

When you click on create your own music. This window will open.

You can add different music to each picture or you can select or create music that will play over some or all of your pictures.

When you are finished adding music to your pictures click the next button.

The last part to creating your photo story is to save the project and to save the photo story to a movie. You can save the photo story project at any time through the creation process. A photo story project can only be opened with the photo story program. A photo story project can be edited over and over again. A photo story movie can not be edit. You can play the photo story movie on any computer that has Windows Media Player. This is free software that can be downloaded from the internet.
